
## DID YOU KNOW?


Sounds such as th, wh, ch, sh, and th are digraphs two letters working together to make one sound. When two or more consonants go smoothly together but keep their own separate sounds, that is called a blend. Examples include st, cl, and mp.

The bonus letters are F, L, S, and sometimes Z! These letters get doubled up after short vowels at the end of one syllable words. For example... puff, mill, mass, and buzz








When do I use k?



When do I use CK? The digraph ck goes at the end of one syllable words after a short vowel!

For example... luck, trick, sack
