

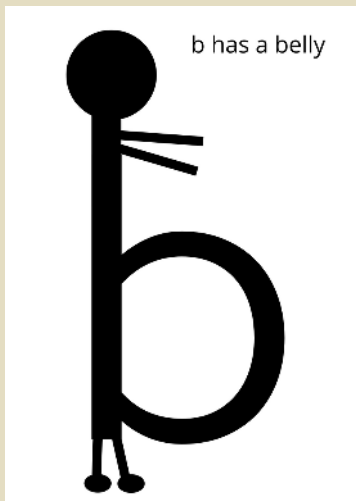


## DID YOU KNOW?

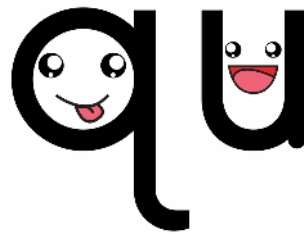
Sounds such as th, wh, ch, sh, and th are digraphs - two letters working together to make one sound. When two or more consonants go smoothly together but keep their own separate sounds, that is called a blend. Examples include st, cl, and mp.

**Z**

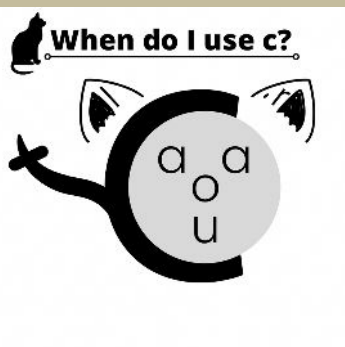
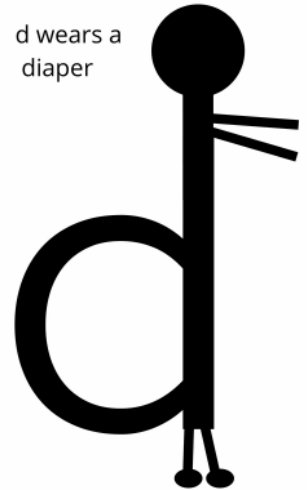
The bonus letters are **F, L, S,** and sometimes **Z!** These letters get doubled up after short vowels at the end of one syllable words. For example... puff, mill, mass, and buzz



q points toward their buddy u



d wears a diaper



When do I use CK?  
The digraph ck goes at the end of one syllable words after a short vowel!

For example...  
luck, trick, sack
